Overview:	This is the first official press conference for EuroSkills Gdańsk 2023, which has been organised to mark exactly one year until the start of the eighth biennial EuroSkills Competition. From 5 to 9 September 2023, the EuroSkills Gdańsk 2023 will welcome 600 skilled young professionals under the age of 25 from 31 countries to participate in competitions and demonstrations in 50 different skills and trades. Around 100,000 visitors from across Poland and abroad are expected to attend the event. This press conference will introduce the idea behind EuroSkills Gdańsk 2023 and present the schedule of preparations for next year's Competition. A panel of distinguished speakers will attend this event, which will be moderated by journalist Marek Zając. The press conference has also been organised to coincide with the official opening of the Erasmus+ InnHUB in Gdańsk – a new innovation centre which focuses on European educational programmes and the promotion of the Erasmus+ offer. The centre will support cooperation between Pomeranian universities, local government and companies to make optimal use of EU funding opportunities.

About EuroSkills Gdańsk 2023

EuroSkills Gdańsk 2023 is the eighth edition of the biennial EuroSkills Competition – the biggest vocational education and skills excellence event in Europe.

Held every two years and organised by WorldSkills Europe together with 31 Member Countries, EuroSkills brings together hundreds of young professionals from countries across Europe to compete for the chance to become the Best in Europe in their chosen skill.



EuroSkills Gdańsk 2023 will take place from 5 to 9 September 2023. The event will welcome 600 skilled young professionals under the age of 25 from 31 countries to participate in competitions and demonstrations in 50 different skills and trades. Around 100,000 visitors from across Poland and abroad are expected to attend.

Visitors to the free-admission Competition will be able to watch the competitors in action and have the opportunity to try hands-on job-related skills at the many 'Try-a-Skill' demonstrations. The tens of thousands of school-aged young people who visit will be encouraged to turn their passions into a profession.

EuroSkills Gdańsk 2023 is organised in partnership by Poland's Foundation For The Development Of The Education System (FRSE), WorldSkills Poland, WorldSkills Europe, the City of Gdańsk and AMBEREXPO Gdańsk.

About WorldSkills Europe

Founded in 2006, WorldSkills Europe is part of the WorldSkills movement – a group of people and organisations, including WorldSkills International, that together advance the shared social objective of increasing the provision and development of skills.

About WorldSkills Poland

Poland officially became a WorldSkills Europe Member Country in 2017, however Poland has a much longer connection with vocational skills, due to the Foundation for the Development of the Education System (FRSE), which has been thriving for 29 years. Since Poland joined WorldSkills Europe and WorldSkills International, structures dedicated to this program have been created within FRSE. These teams work to organise both the WorldSkills Poland championship in 2023 as well as numerous workshops, annual championships and side events.

Earlier, under a different organisation, Poland competed at EuroSkills Rotterdam 2008 and returned again under the direction of FRSE for EuroSkills Budapest 2018, with the team entering eight skills. At EuroSkills Budapest 2018, Poland achieved a Medallion for Excellence in Cooking, and at EuroSkills Graz 2021, Poland achieved its best results so far at a EuroSkills Competition, winning three bronze medals.

Since 1993, the Foundation for the Development of the Education System (FRSE) has managed programmes, projects and initiatives aimed at broadening basic and specialist knowledge and acquisition of new skills and competencies in formal, non-formal and informal education settings.



FRSE is the only institution in Poland that possesses such a broad experience in managing education programmes, especially EU programmes. In the past, it has coordinated the Lifelong Learning Programme (Erasmus, Leonardo da Vinci, Comenius and Grundtvig) and Youth in Action in Poland. The reputation of the Foundation has resulted in entrusting it with the responsibilities of the Polish National Agency for the Erasmus+ Programme and the European Solidarity Corps.
